Dear Beloved South Church.

Once again, words cannot express my deepest gratitude to each of you for the immense spirit of joy you brought to Installation Sunday. I celebrate each of you, and praise God for giving us the opportunity to join in ministry together.

This month we continue the journey of Lent and conclude on March 31 with Easter Sunday. During Holy Week – Palm Sunday through Good Friday – I especially invite you to pause and take time for prayer and worship. Rehearsing the events of the last week of Jesus' life – as we do every year – enables us to both to appreciate and experience more deeply the astonishing joy of Easter Sunday. I invite you to take time for:

- Palm Sunday March 24 at 10:00 am we wave our palms as Jesus makes his way to Jerusalem.
- Holy Week Spiritual Beach Walk Monday, March 25 at 11:00 am (rain date Tuesday, March 26. We will sing, share readings, pray, and walk quietly. Please bring along a favorite reading (poetry, prose, the Bible, etc)
- Maundy Thursday Thursday, March 28 at 6:30 pm we will share a simple supper, receive Holy Communion in remembrance of the Last Supper, and have a service of "Tenebrae" reading the dramatic story of Jesus' betrayal, arrest, mocking, and crucifixion, all with the gradual diminishing of lights to symbolize how we abandon Jesus when he most needs us.
- Good Friday Friday, March 29 at 12:00 noon we stand at the foot of the Cross with Mary and the disciples through reflections on the "Seven Last Words of Jesus." And then,
  - Saturday Easter Egg Hunt Saturday, March 30 from 10:00 am noon on the church lawn (sponsored by the Centerville Civic Association)
  - Easter Sunday a time for awe and upliftment and joy!

**Festive Easter Worship** – March 31 at 10:00 am. Amazing music and spirit! Let's fill the Sanctuary with joy!

#### **KAREN'S CORNER**

#### "Jesus, Remember me, when you come into your Kingdom..."

To mark the Liturgical Season of Lent which began on Ash Wednesday, we are singing a chant from the Taize' Community at the beginning of each service.

The Taize' Community is an ecumenical monastery near Burgundy, France. It is comprised of roughly 100 monks, both Catholic and Protestant, from about 30 countries around the globe. Tens of thousands of people make pilgrimages annually to Taize'.

The style of worship at Taize' is characterized by the repetitive singing of simple songs interspersed with readings, prayers and silence.

While a chant sung at Taize might go on for 20 minutes, we sing "Jesus, Remember Me" five times through. I encourage you to use repetition as an aid for introspection. Lift your head out of your bulletin and engage with your surroundings as you sing, or simply close your eyes and let the music move through you. Let the music help set a prayerful tone for you to begin the service.
