A Reflection from Sally:

Earlier in the summer, I attended a concert with Livingston Taylor and the Cape Cod Symphony. If you wonder who Livingston Taylor is, so did I. I had never heard of him! But in doing some research prior to the concert, I discovered that he is the younger brother of James Taylor. I had no idea what to expect of the concert and I convinced myself that it might be quite boring. To my surprise, the concert was absolutely amazing! Livingston Taylor is an exceptional musician. With guitar and banjo in hand, and with occasional accompaniment by the Cape Cod Symphony, Livingston Taylor performed an array of the most engaging music — from his own compositions to the "Great American Songbook" to even a song by his brother, James. The concert included a medley of "train" songs including "I've been Working on the Railroad," "The Trolley Song," "Chattanooga ChooChoo," and "On the Atchinson, Topeka, and the Santa Fe." And he performed a hilarious medley of "songs that shouldn't be played on the banjo." Laughter abounded!

I came away from the concert feeling uplifted and joy-filled! I was strengthened and refreshed to take on the world's challenges once again. This is exactly the same way I felt after the awesome Peter Mayer concert. And from what many of you have said, you felt the same way!

Livingston Taylor describes his purpose in performing: "The rule of performing is that an audience needs to come away from their involvement with you feeling better about themselves than when they walked in. That brings us to the question: what do people want? Above all else, people want to believe they are seen, that they are heard, that somebody is enthusiastic about their presence, that they are needed, and above all, that they have the power to heal broken hearts."

Wow! Sounds like a mission statement for a church!

I wonder – can we take these words from Livingston Taylor and enhance them with the lens of faith and make this our goal when we worship together, when we volunteer together, when plan and envision together, when we have fellowship together, and when we are in mission together?

Let's make South Church a place where this wisdom from Livingston informs our church life together in this new program year – 2024-2025.

And what about bringing a friend to worship on Sunday? Let's get the word out

That South Church is a welcoming, nurturing, and mission-focused community. When it comes to church growth, we are all in it together.

TUESDAYS AT 2:00 BIBLE STUDY THE PSALMS

October 1, 8, 15, 22, 29 (Led by Rev. Sally Norris)

Whenever I ask — "what is your favorite book of the Bible" — I inevitably receive the response: "The Psalms." This is understandable. The Psalms are deeply personal, poignant prayers and songs; they speak viscerally to the heart. They instruct. They bring strength and comfort, and guide us in how to praise God. But there is so much more to the Psalms than you might initially think!

For five weeks in October, we will study this most beloved part of the Bible. Here are the particulars:

- What do I need to bring?

A Bible. Perhaps paper or a commuter for taking notes. But most of all, an open and curious spirit. If you do not have a Bible, let me know and I'll make sure you have one.

- Where?

The Fellowship Room. It will be good to have a table where we can write and easily read our Bibles

- Format?

The first session will set the historical and structural foundation. Of all the sessions, this will be the most lecture-like. But I'll do my best to make it lively. You may even learn a bit of Hebrew! Hopefully you will discover new things about the Psalms. In subsequent sessions we will do closer study of individual Psalms. And who knows – you may be inspired to write your own "Psalm!"

And then **looking ahead**: During **Advent** we will have a three-week Bible Study series on the **Nativity in Art.**
