


Karen's Corner

On Sunday, November 17th, we will have a guest musician joining us for worship. "Candida Rose", whom Sally met at the Juneteenth Ceremony in Hyannis, is an artist who describes herself as one "where music, culture and spirit entwine".

Born and raised in New Bedford, Massachusetts, "Candida Rose" Baptista is a 2nd generation American-born Cape Verdean. She is a vocalist, song-writer, entertainer, music and cultural educator, as well as a mother and grandmother. She is a graduate of the University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth where she graduated "Summa Cum Laude" with a Bachelor of Arts – Music Degree, specializing in African-American/World music performance, with a minor in African-American Studies.

In addition, she recently graduated from UMASS Boston with a Masters of Science Degree in Transnational, Cultural, and Community Studies (now known as Critical Ethnic and Community Studies). As a working performer, in addition to her work with various jazz, R&B, and Cape Verdean musical groups, through her company Golden Rose Music, Candida spends her days traveling the SouthCoast region of Massachusetts and Rhode Island as a Life Enrichment Entertainer singing for Nursing Home, Assisted Living and Adult Day Care facilities, as well as for various churches, senior groups and associations. It is said that she captivates her audiences and stirs them with a uniquely compelling voice that combines the overtones and undertones of jazz, rhythm and blues, and gospel with just the right touch of international spice.

It Wasn't All Bad

On a hot August day, Josh and Rebecca Caldwell, ages 8 and 10, were selling lemonade outside their Chesapeake, VA., home when a stranger walked up to their stand and stole \$40 from their money jar. After their mom, Annetta, encouraged them to set up a new stand, neighbors learned about the incident, and 10 days later, some 650 people came to the sale, including a group of 130 bikers. Strangers from Indiana to Pennsylvania even mailed them money. That day, the siblings collected around \$6,500, and the thief was later apprehended. "My kids feel so loved," said Annetta.

It Wasn't All Bad

When police in Lebanon, N.H., responded to a report of a German Shepherd on a snow-covered highway, they thought it was a stray. Then, the dog ran away from them and led them into Vermont, where it stopped near a broken guardrail and its owner's wrecked pickup truck. "It quickly became apparent that Tinsley led (Police) to the crash site and injured occupants," the New Hampshire State Police wrote on Facebook. The truck's two occupants were hypothermic and seriously injured and were transported to the hospital. Tinsley, the heroic pup, was not injured in the crash.

It Wasn't All Bad

A 10-year-old saved his grandfather's life when he grabbed the wheel of a pickup truck traveling on the highway at 70 miles per hour. After Hugh Cox, a 68-year-old Georgia man, suddenly lost consciousness, his grandson Drake Linn climbed onto his lap and took over. Thanks to his experience driving golf carts and ATV's, Linn was able to steer the car through busy traffic and pull over. He called 911 from the side of the road; rescue workers quickly revived Cox, who had fallen into a diabetic coma. "My own child saved my own parent." Said Linn's mother. "It made my heart swell."

"Forest Bathing"

Dr. Carol Macy is available to lead us on a "Forest Bathing" walk. We will keep you informed on the time!

This is from Carol's website:

"The concept of forest bathing grew out of a practice in Japan called Shinrin-yoku that spread to China and Korea and now to the United States. It is about swimming in the living being of the forest: drinking in the smells, feeling the breeze on your skin, hearing it move through the trees, soaking up the warm healing rays of the sun, noticing the vast array of colors and shapes of life around you, experiencing Nature. This is a meditative practice. By slowing down, connecting with awareness to the abundant life in and around you, these walks can be immensely healing. This experience helps you to feel refreshed, calmer and at peace. Your body, mind, spirit and heart have an opportunity to feel a deep sense of connection between yourself and life. Cape Cod gives you a very special opportunity to deepen your relationship with Nature because of the unique environments provided by marsh, creek, ponds, forest, dunes and beach."



Reiki is a Japanese spiritual healing technique in which practitioners can help your body heal itself. "Rei" translates to "Universe" or "life force, and "ki" translated to the physical energy of the body (also known as qi); put together, Reiki translates to "universal life force energy." 
