WELCOME TO 2025

In January we begin a new season of the church year: Epiphany!

Practically speaking, Epiphany is the twelfth day of Christmas – January 6. According to tradition, Epiphany is the day that the Magi – guided by the Star - arrived at the manger bearing gifts for the newborn Child Jesus. This is why we sing "We Three Kings" on Epiphany Sunday even though it seems like we are beyond Christmas carol season!

But the full season of Epiphany has deeper significance. The word "Epiphany" derives from an ancient Greek word meaning "reveal" or "manifest." So, theologically-speaking, Epiphany – both the day and the season – teaches about how God is revealed to us through Jesus Christ. Symbols of Epiphany are "star" and "light." Just as the Magi were led by the Star to the manger, so also we are led by the light of God to a deeper understanding of who Jesus is and how the light of faith is manifest in the our lives and in the world.

The theme of "light" actually makes sense with the earth's rhythm. The days gradually are getting longer – there is a bit more daylight each day as we go through the Epiphany.

Our Sunday worship during this Epiphany season (from January 5 – March 2) will reflect these themes, in particular the theme of "light." Hope you will join with us each Sunday at 10:00 am:





Rabbi Robinson & his wife are residents of Centerville. He earned a BA degree from Coe College and a Bachelor of Hebrew Letters in 1972, a Master of Arts and ordination as a Rabbi in 1974 from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion. In 1999 the College Institute awarded him the degree of Doctor of Divinity.

Following ordination, he was Rabbi of Temple Israel of Gary, Ind., 1974-1977, the Cape Cod Synagogue (1977-1998) and B'nai Zion Congregation in Shreveport, La, 1998-2006. He has served on numerous boards and commissions, including the Commission on Social Action of Reform Judaism, the Resolutions Committee of Reform Judaism and the Commission on Religious Living of Reform Judaism. He served as Chair of the Massachusetts Commission Against Discrimination, Cape and Islands Advisory Council. As a Rear Admiral in the US Naval Reserve he served as Chaplain and then Chief of Naval Chaplains. Personal awards include The Distinguished Service Medal and the Naval Commendation Medal.




Every January, Cape Cod remembers the legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. You may find the following event on Sunday January 19 of interest. It is sponsored by the NAACP and other organizations including the Cape Cod Council of Churches:

Celebrate the legacy of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on Sunday, January 19. This special ecumenical service will begin at 3 PM at First Baptist Church, Hyannis. The service may also be accessed online at www.FBCHyannis.org.

The service will feature keynote speaker Roberto Mighty, the creator of the WGBH documentary, "Legacy of Love," which explores the early years of Dr. King's and Coretta Scott's relationship while they were students living in Boston. He will speak about their mutual dedication to advancing racial and economic equity.

Mr. Mighty is currently completing an augmented reality project about colonial African Americans, and two museum exhibits about Native American heritage and culture.
