An exciting way to celebrate the Holy Spirit on Pentecost is through God's amazing gift of music! How glorious that Pentecost and Music Sunday are the same Sunday – June 8! We will inaugurate our "Negro Spirituals Royalties Initiative" and celebrate the joy of South Church music.

From the Pastoral Relations Team

During the pandemic, we all segued into a 24/7 world, in particular our communication. This made sense, given the limitations on public gatherings. We honed connections with family, friends, church, and work through our iPhones, Androids, and zoom. But being "on" 24/7 can lead to "burnout" and we don't want to see that with Pastor Sally and Karen Crosby.

The Pastoral Relations Committee meets periodically with Pastor Sally as an advisory group to the pastor and as a support group for her leadership. An ongoing concern of this committee is that Pastor Sally improve her work/life balance so that she is not responding to calls, texts, and emails on a 24/7 basis. We desire this for Karen Crosby also. This expectation of 24/7 communication is detrimental to a healthy church life, and needs to be re-aligned with our values of respecting boundaries and supporting both our Pastor and our Minister of Music.

Rev. Sally is a ³/₄ time pastor (i.e. averaging 35 hours per week). The Pastoral Relations Committee has recommended to Leadership Circle that we all adhere to the following business hours in texting, emailing, or phoning the staff (as well as other church members after 5 pm)

- Monday (Sally's day off)
- Tuesday Friday: 8 am 5 pm

• Sat/Sun: weekend – Saturday is the day for worship preparation and community events. Please limit emails, texts and calls. For pastoral emergencies or a sensitive matter, please phone.

Please note:

1. Dial 911 in case of an emergency. Rev. Sally (or her substitute during vacation) is of course available in case of an emergency in which she is needed.

2. Rev. Sally will write in her emails and voicemail when to expect a response. Please understand that she cannot always respond to texts and emails immediately.

3. Your emails can be written anytime, but after 5 pm, please plan to schedule your emails to be sent at 8:00 am the next morning (or another time). This is possible to do on any computer or cell phone, all of which have "schedule

send" options. (Please contact the Pastoral Relations Committee on how to activate a 'schedule send.')

4. Consider your fellow church volunteers and committee members! Plan to communicate with them during the day, unless it is a time sensitive matter.

Karen Crosby is a half-time Music Minister (i.e., 20 hrs per week). Karen's time is also spent on worship preparation, rehearsals, and Sunday services. She is available for emails or calls during these times: Tuesday - Thursday: 12-5

Also, Office Hours for Karen Morin: Mon thru Thursday 8:00am-1:00pm

Research has shown that setting boundaries when sending texts or emails provides numerous benefits, including improved mental health, stronger relationships, and increased productivity. If we abide by communication flows that respect needs and limits, we can prevent burnout, enhance self-esteem, and reduce stress. This also fosters more respectful and fulfilling interactions, both online and offline.




